


# **Adoption is the Best Option**

- What supplies does the pet need?
- What food and how much does the pet eat?
- What is the pet's activity level?







# Tag - You're Mine!

How can you help your pet return home safely if they ever get lost? Always make sure your pet is wearing a collar and identification (ID) tags with your phone number and pet's name.

## Happy to be home! Draw a happy face on this dog and fill in the ID tag with the pet's name and phone number.



Since collars and ID tags can fall off, ask your veterinarian or local shelter about getting your pet a permanent ID called a **microchip**! A microchip goes under your pet's skin, right between the shoulder blades, and stays there forever.

Other pets like rabbits, and even some turtles can be microchipped too!



## Paws Off!


Our pets need special food made just for them, and they need the right amount of food to stay healthy. Always do your research and make sure the food is safe before giving it to your pet. There are many "human" foods that can make your pet sick.






Check the ingredients for XYLITOL (sometimes called "birch sugar"). Xylitol can be found in some toothpastes, as well as foods like peanut butter, sugar-free candies, and gum. It is very poisonous to pets, so be sure to always check!

 If you can easily see your pet's rib bones or hip bones, they may need more food, or they may need to see the vet.

• Be sure to fill your pet's water bowl with fresh water each day, and clean their food and water bowls at least once a week.


# **Training Builds Trust**

## Training keeps your pet safe, teaches them manners, and helps build a bond between you and your pet.

- 1. Make training fun and positive!
  - Keep it simple and be patient.
  - Practice a few minutes each day.
  - Use rewards that your pet loves most, like yummy treats, toys, and kind words.
- 2. Get the whole family involved and be consistent!
- 3. Reward your pet's behavior quickly. Your pet needs to know what they did right!
- 4. Never hit, yell at, or do anything to harm your pet.
  - The pet will associate pain and fear with you rather than the behavior, so it does nothing to change the behavior. It just makes them scared of you!
  - Using punishment does not teach your pet how to make better behavior choices in the future.

# **Don't Delay-Neuter or Spay!**

Pets need an operation to prevent them from having babies. This operation is called spaying for females and neutering for males. Spay or neuter surgery provides benefits for you, your pet, and your community.








# **Make Time to Play Every Day**


Stand to the side of the dog. Pet gently on the dog's back or side.

What if a loose dog you don't know rushes up to you? How do you stay safe? **Don't run.** Dogs love to chase!


Don't stare at the dog. This can make the dog feel threatened.



# I Can Respect Wildlife


Pets depend on people for all of their needs, and they feel safe and happy being around us. Nature provides everything wild animals need to survive on their own, but they feel scared or upset around people.


# I Can Help Animals

- Someone is doing something to hurt them.






